This week the Reception children have been learning that God loves them and their families.



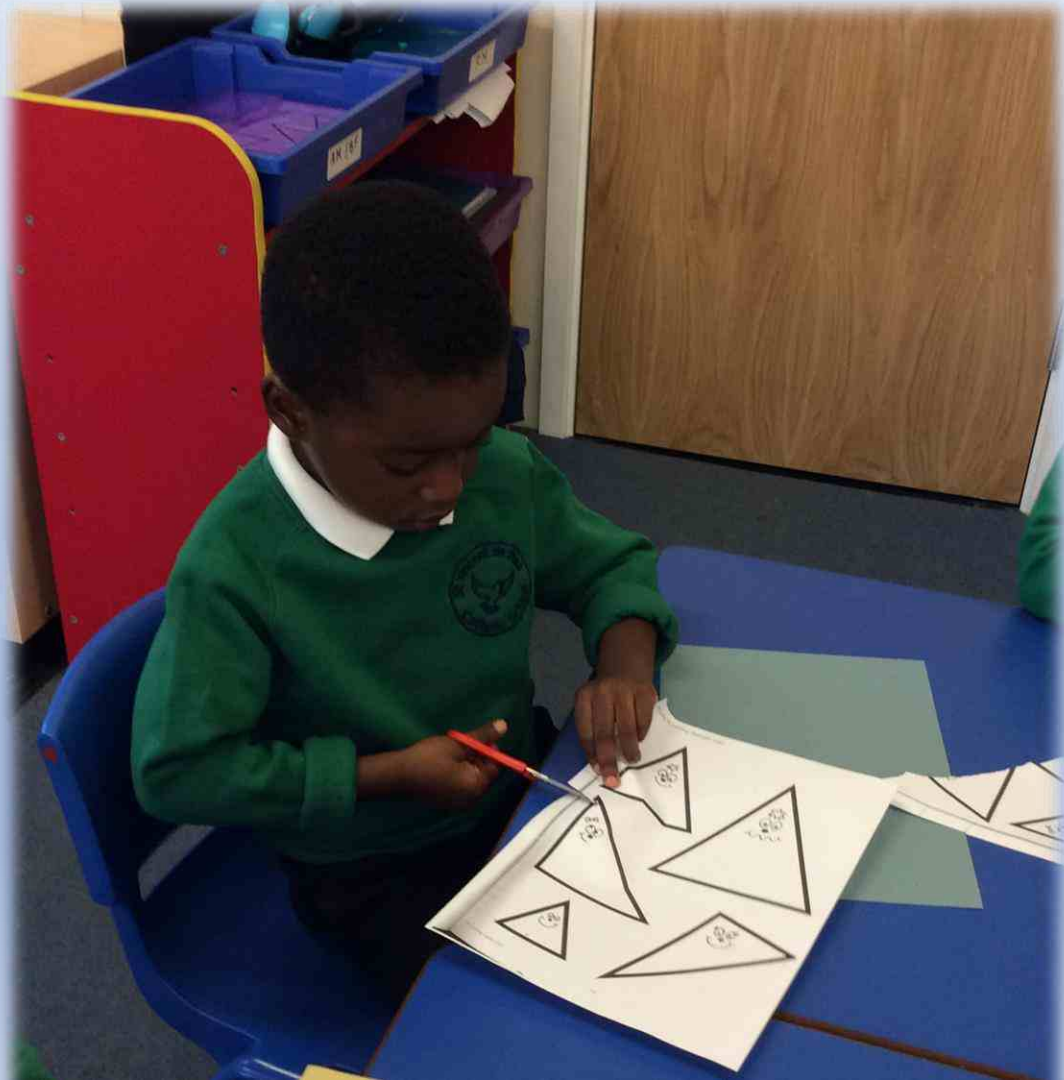

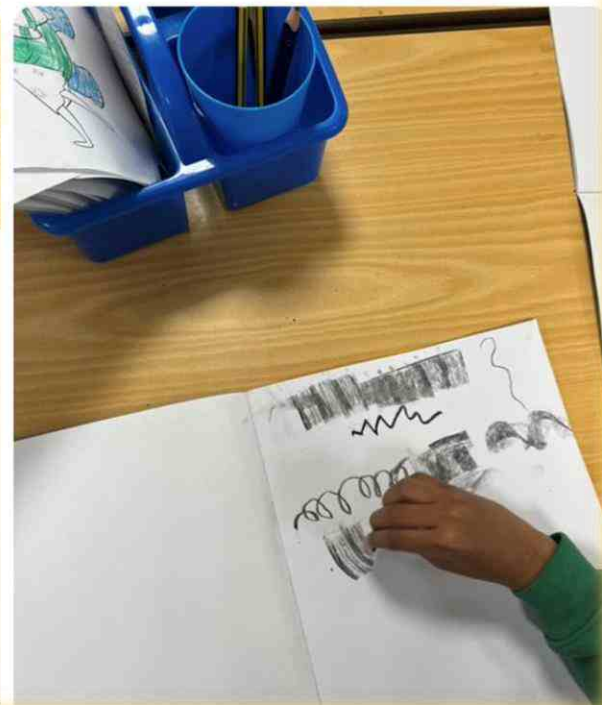
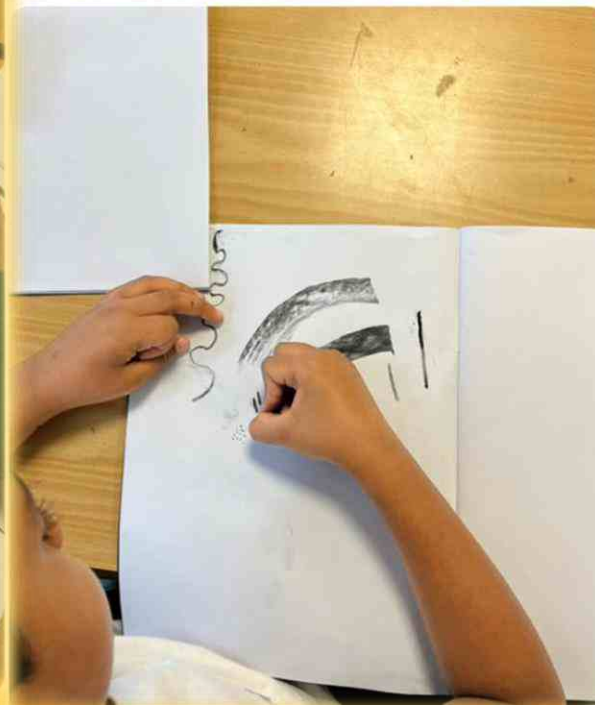
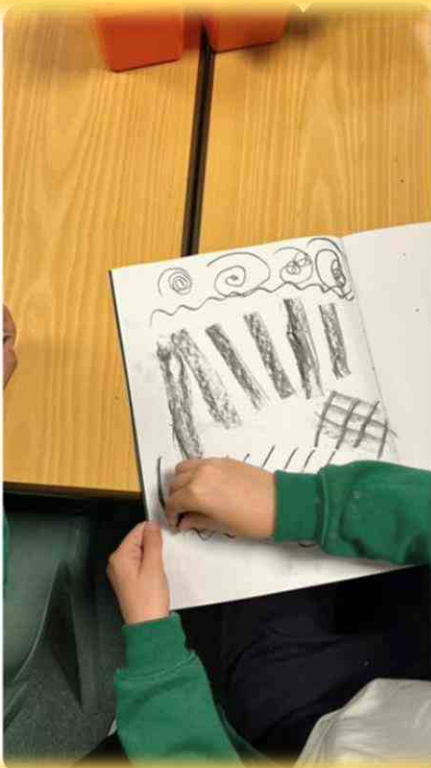
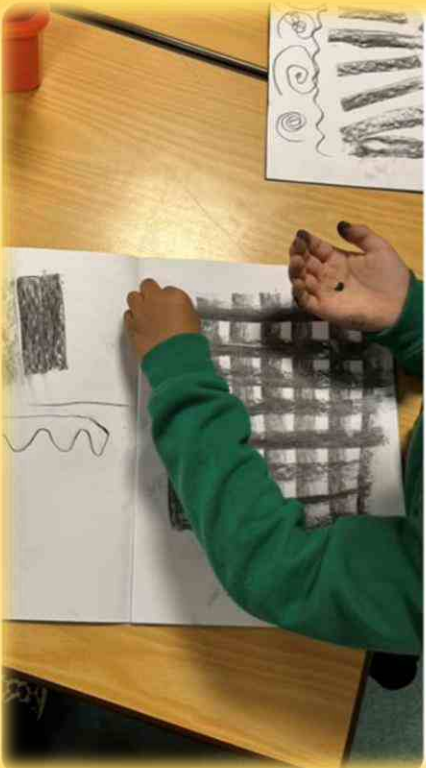
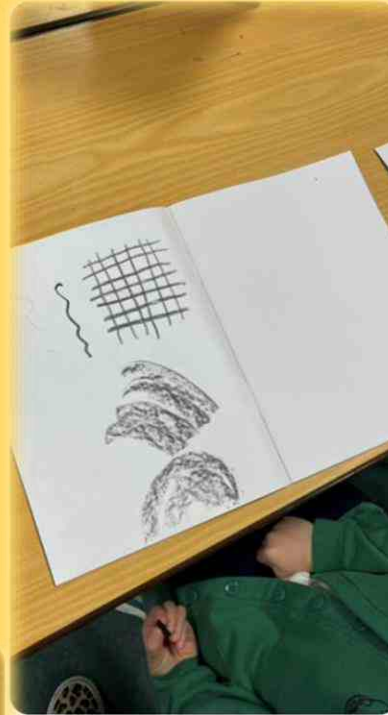
Year 1 meeting the daily Commonwealth Games chair sprint challenge, having great fun!

Our Reception children have been busy learning through play — indoors and outdoors!

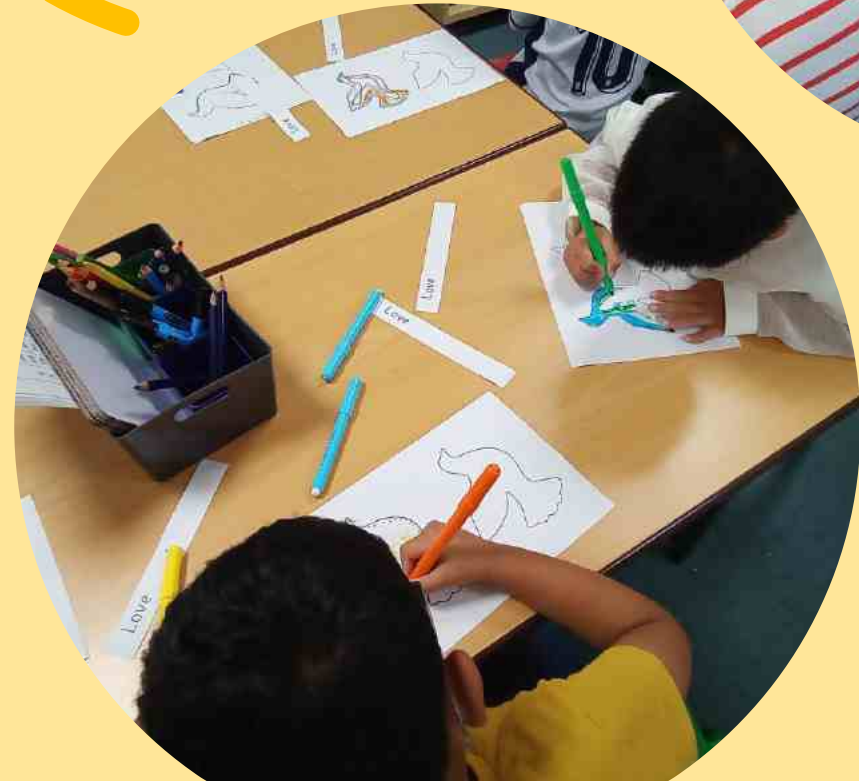




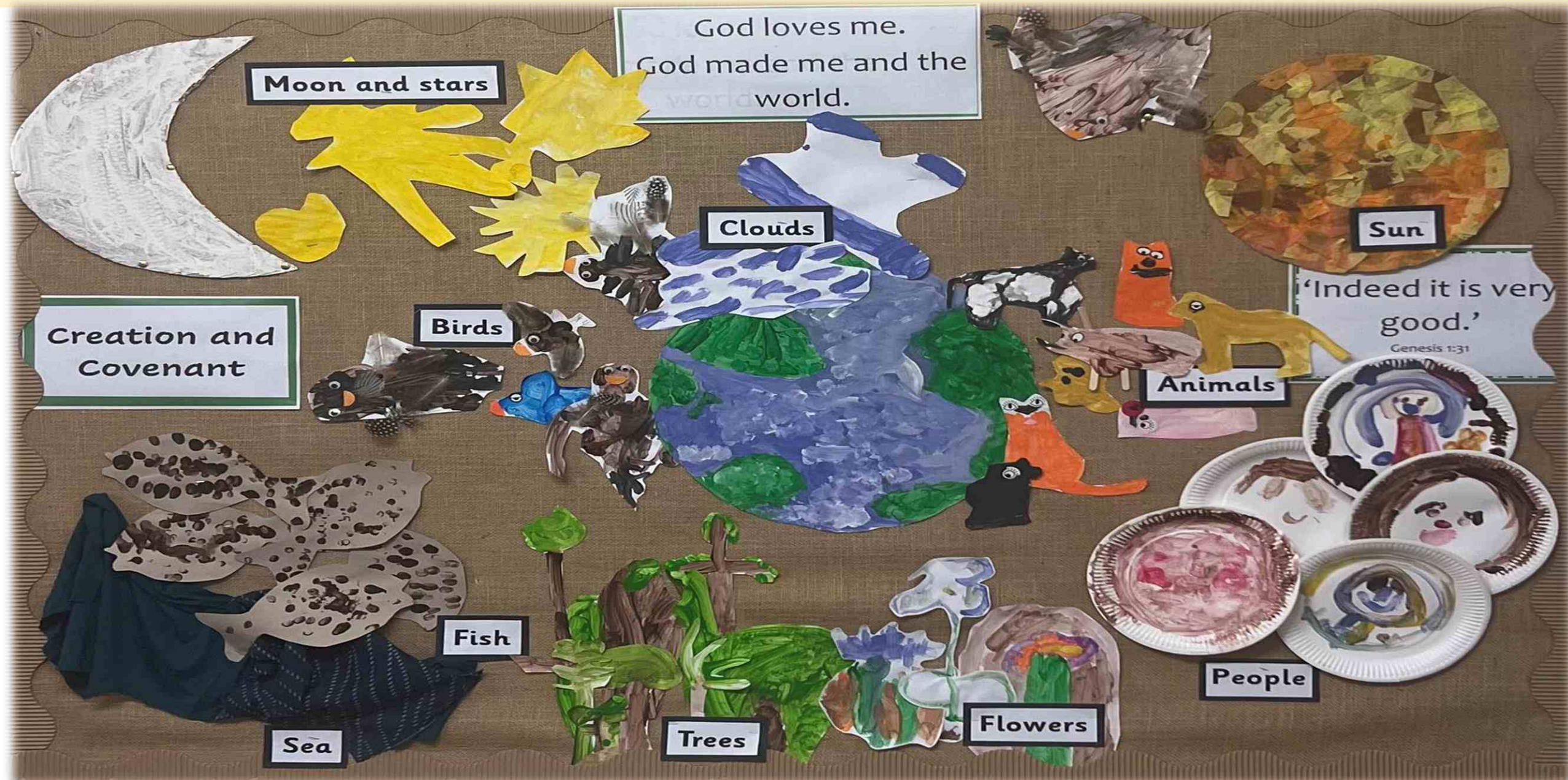
Year 2 Pasteur really enjoyed experimenting with charcoal in art.

competition.

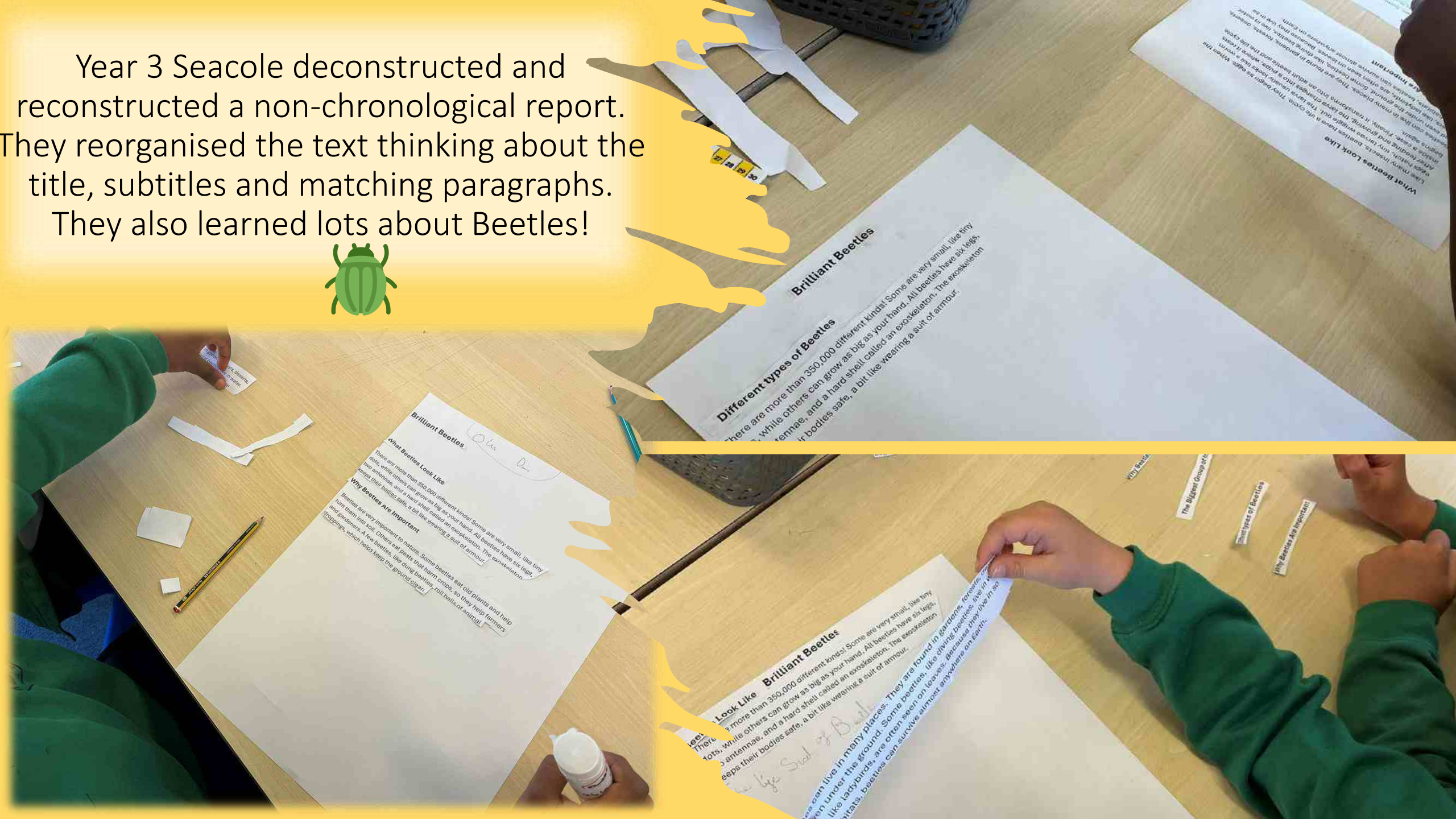

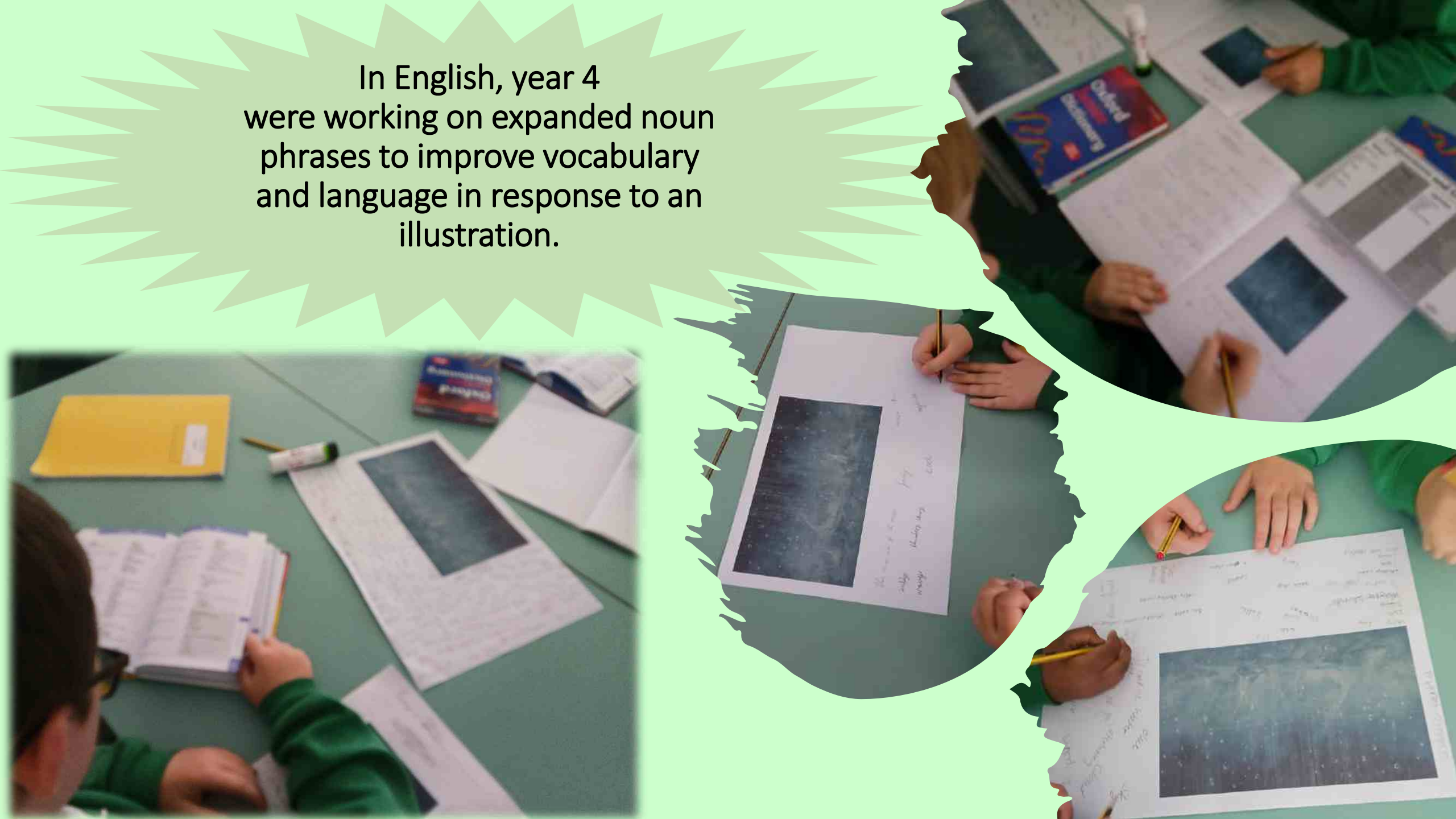


Reception Mozart enjoyed their PE on Thursday;

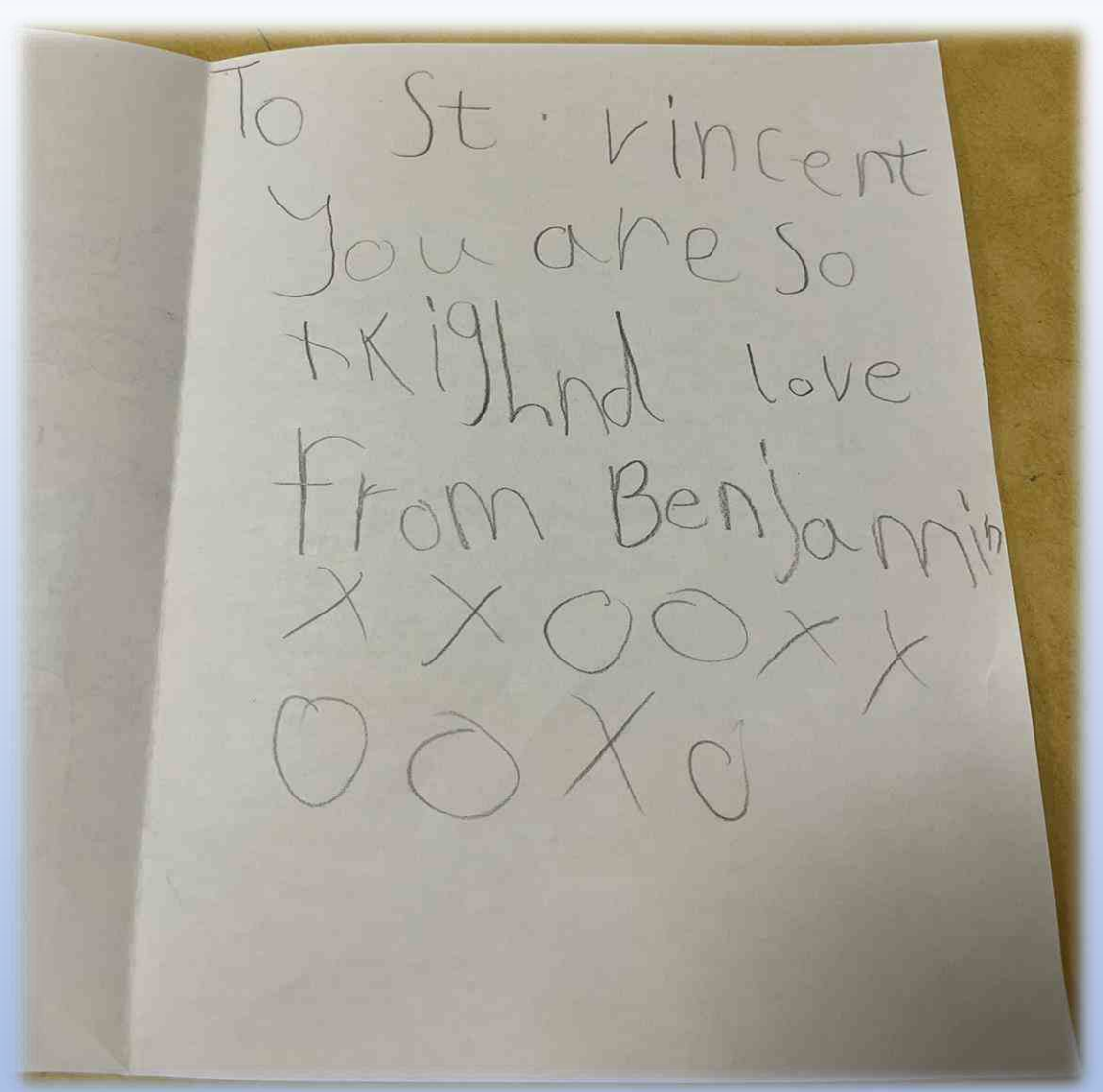
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CELEBRATING ST VINCENT DE PAUL DAY IN RECEPTION.

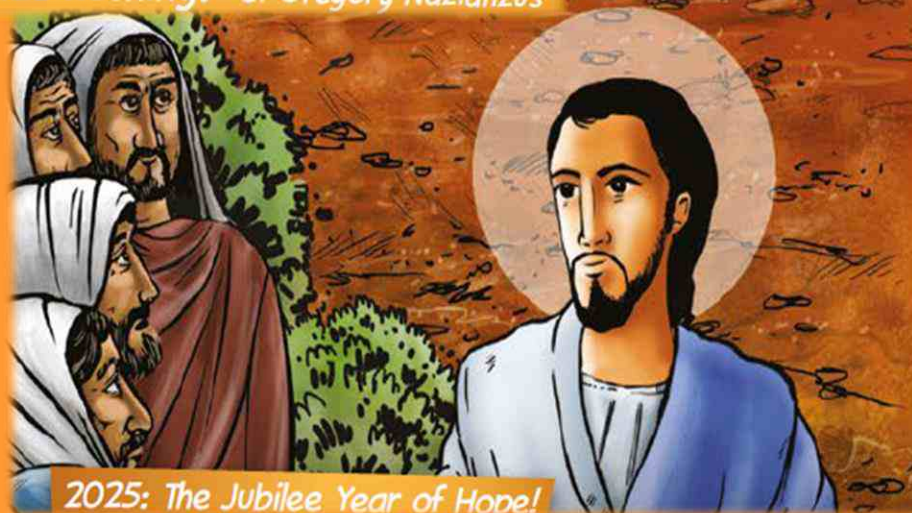
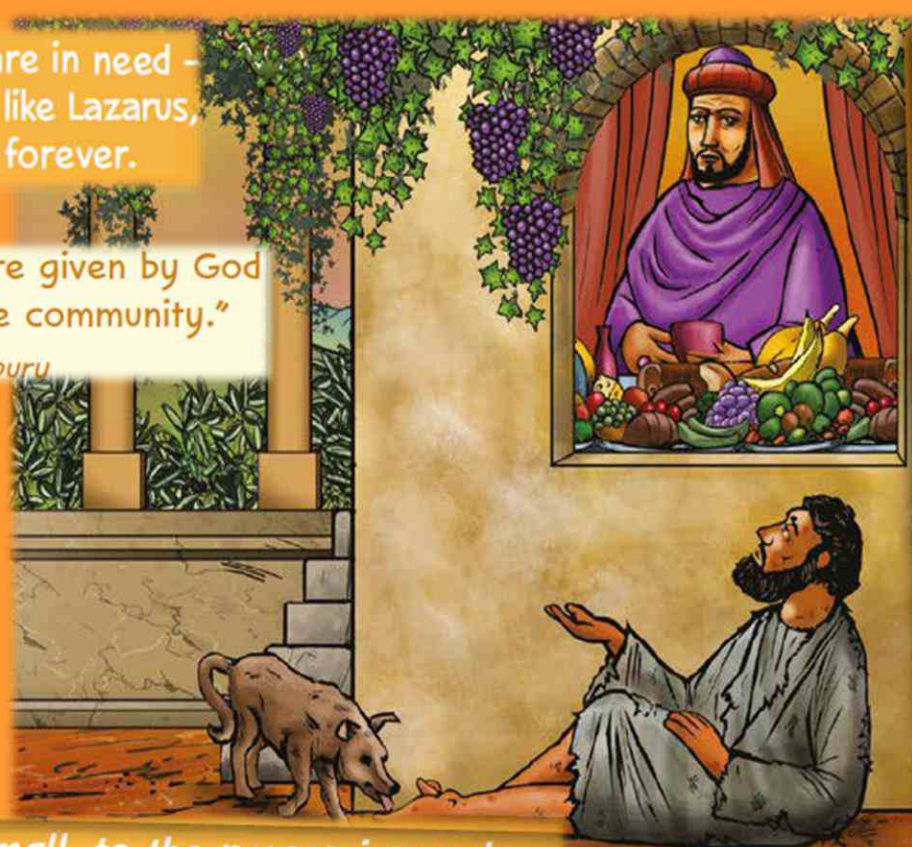
