








Reception are enjoying visiting the library. They are sharing and expressing preferences for books.

How can having Jesus in your heart help to guide your thoughts, words and actions?


Now think of one loving choice you can make in how you speak to others today.

You worked so well as a team and amazed us all!






Investigative play in Nursery this week.

What a wonderful world He has made!














Phonics Friday!


Jesus said, "The one who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the one who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with
