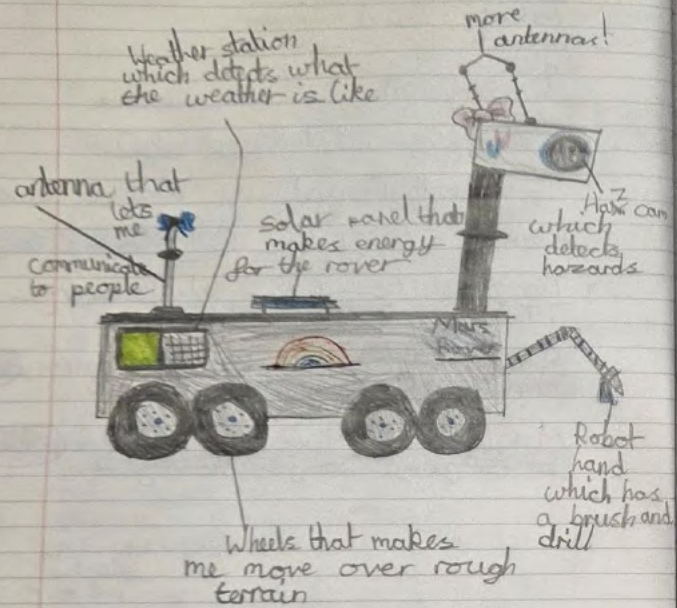

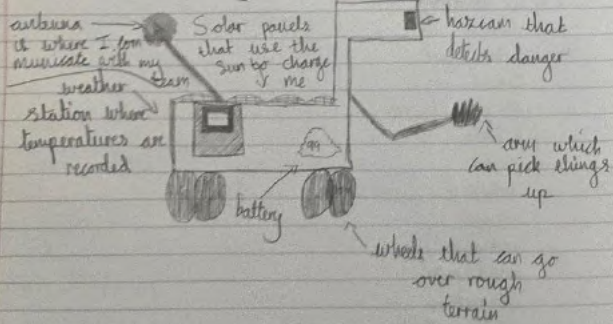

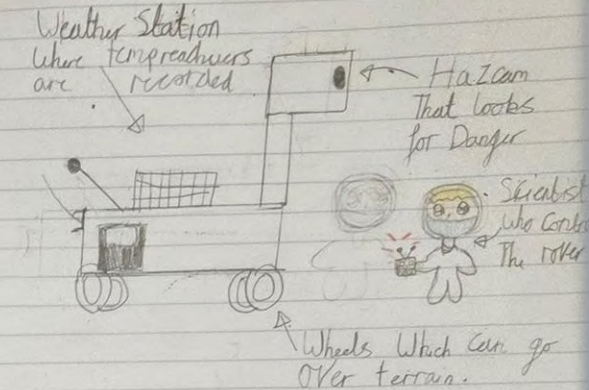
In English, Year 5 Agnesi have enjoyed reading a book called 'Curiosity - The Story of a Mars Rover'.

They have designed their own rovers for Mars and labelled the features using relative clauses.

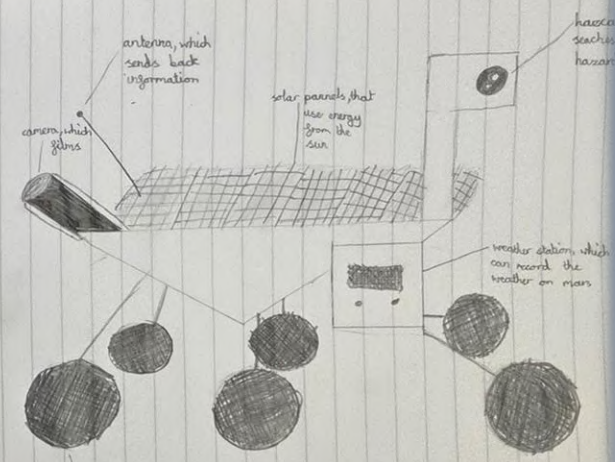

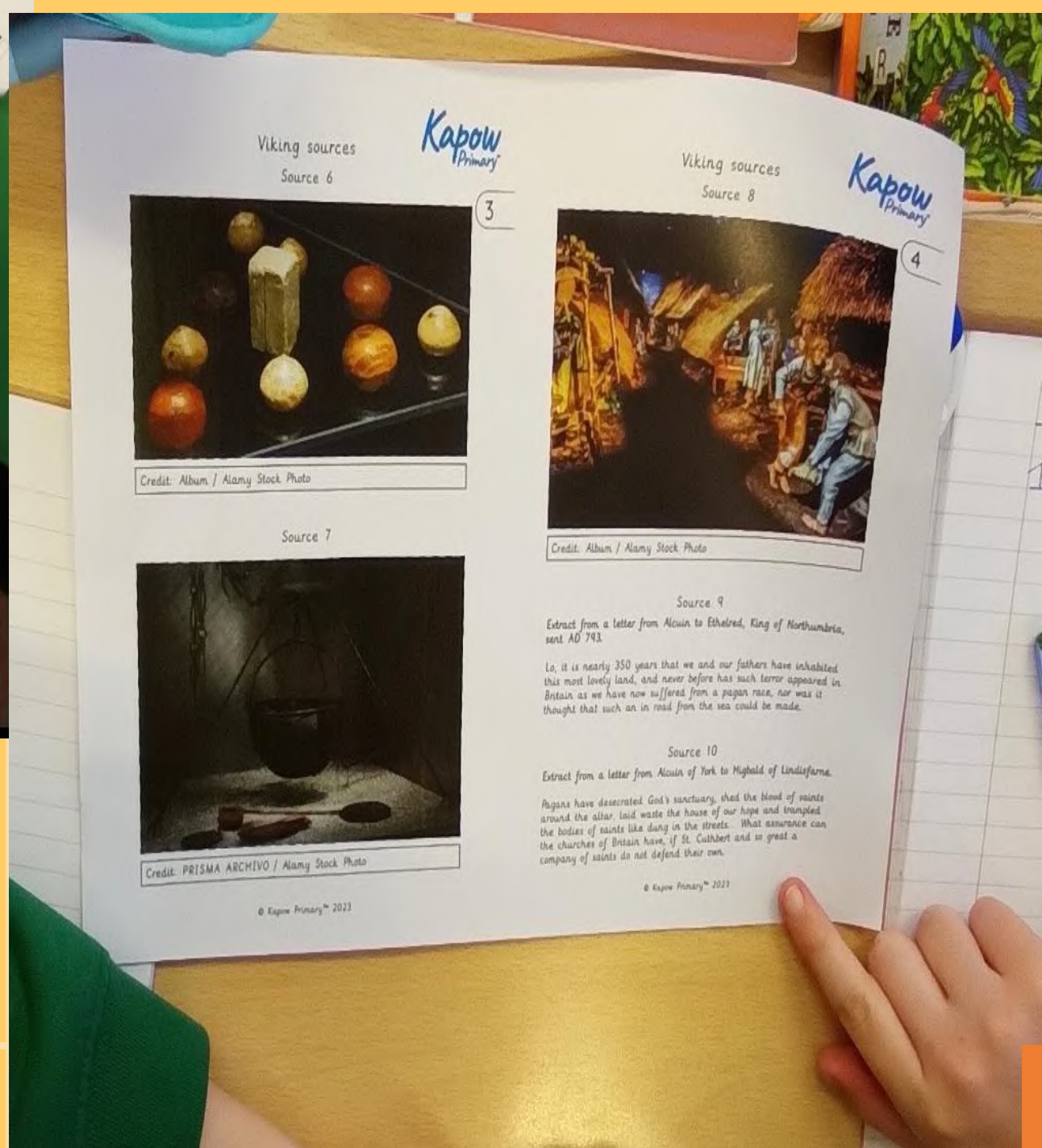


Some great experiments taking place during our Year 2 STEM workshop this past week. The children had to test how durable the different materials were and create a tally chart.

Pagans have desecrated God's sanctuary, shed the blood of saints around the altar, laid waste the houses of our hope and trampled the bodies of saints like dung in the streets. What assurance can the churches of Britain have, if St. Cuthbert and so great a company of saints do not defend their own.

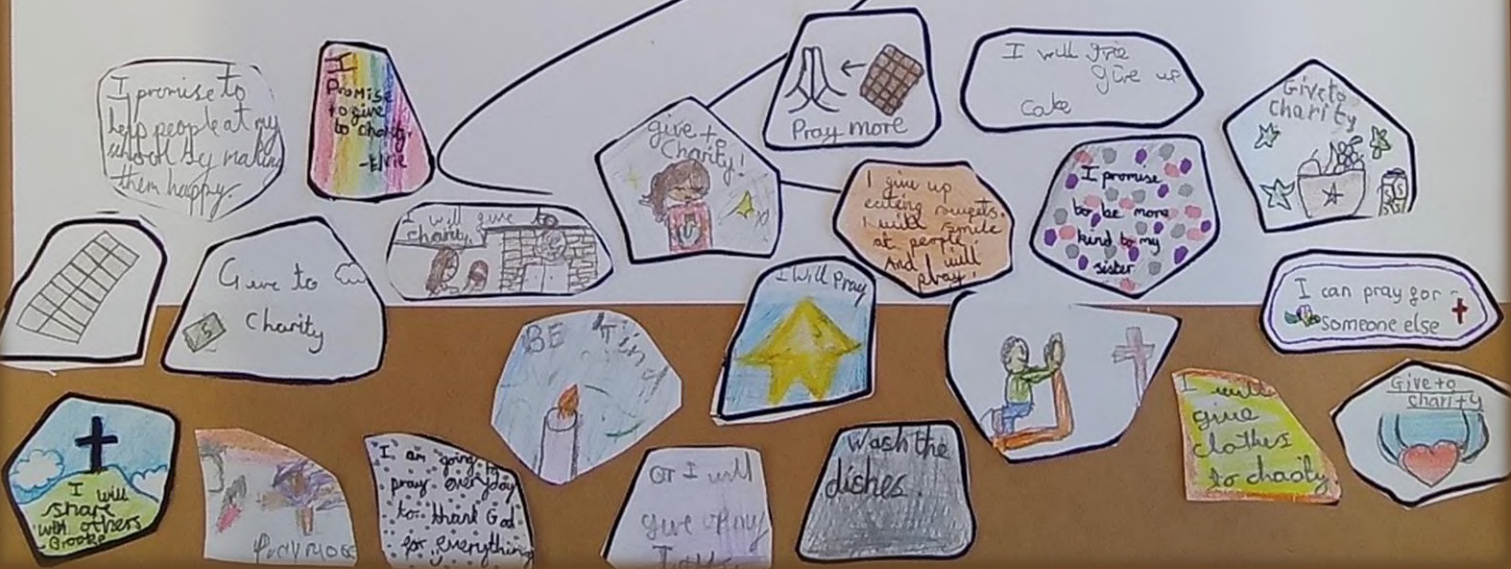

HOLY WEEK

"This week alone, unique in the full sense of the word, is the week of the Lord's Passion. It is Holy Week." *St John Paul II*
